- Environment protection and sustainable use of natural resources


Theatre II: Desired CSR

Philanthropic activities (generally after making a profit)


Theatre III: Admired CSR

• क) वार्षिक रुपमा सहकारीको कार्यक्षेत्रभित्र सामूदायिक क्रियाकलापहरु सञ्चालन गर्नको लागि यो कोषको उपयोग गरिनेछ।

- सामुदायिक विकास कोषको उपयोग : सामुदायिक विकास कोषमा जम्मा गरिएको रकम समुदायप्रतिको चासोको सहकारी सिद्धान्त अनुरूप देहायका कार्यहरूमा उपयोग गर्न सिकनेछ:
- (क) सहकारी संस्थाको कार्यक्षेत्रभित्र गैरसदस्यहरूको समेत समान पहुँच रहने गरी प्रदान गरिने <u>शिक्षा,</u> स्वास्थ्य, खानेपानीजस्ता सामूहिक सेवाको व्यवस्था,
- (ख) बाटोघाटो, पुलपुलेसा, पाटीपौवा, ढलनिकास, ऐतिहासिक सम्पदाजस्ता सार्वजनिक वस्तुको निर्माण वा जतन,
- (ग) महिला सुरक्षा, अभिभावकविहीन बालबालिकाको पारिवारिक हेरचाह (फोस्टर केयर), ज्येष्ठ नागरिक आश्रय, अपाङ्गता भएका व्यक्तिहरूका लागि समुदायमा आधारित पुनस्र्थापना, सार निर्भरता (सब्स्टेन्स डेपेन्डेन्स) उपचार केन्द्रजस्ता विशेष सरोकारका पहल,
- (घ) मिश्रित खेतीपातीको जगेर्ना, रैथाने जातको संरक्षण, भू—क्षयको रोकथाम, जैविक विविधता प्रवर्धन, स्थानीय प्रविधिको उपयोगजस्ता प्राकृतिक स्रोत संरक्षण एवं हावापानी अनुकूलन (एडप्टेसन) वा अल्पीकरण (मिटिगेसन) का उपायहरूको अवलम्बन,
- (ङ) विपद्को प्रतिकार्यका सिलसिलामा आफ्नो कार्यक्षेत्रभित्र वा बाहिर प्रदान गरिने मानवीय सहायता,
- (च) खण्ड (क), (ख), (ग), (घ) र (ङ) बमोजिमका कार्यका लागि प्राविधिक, वित्तीय वा वस्तुगत योगदान, र
- (छ) अन्य सामुदायिक एवं मानवीय सरोकारविशेषका गतिविधि ।


Critical Evaluation of the Existing Legal Provisions in Cooperative Act, Regulation, and Guidelines

- Guided by narrow conceptualization of CSR, i.e. only community development/philanthropic CSR.
- Internal CSR, other stakeholder-related CSR, cross-sector collaboration, and CSV are ignored.
- Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) is not yet developed and enforced.


SOP may include (but not limited to): Guiding principles and parameters; CSR governance mechanism at national level and firm level; Channels for implementing CSR projects; Guidelines on CSR basket fund (if any); Provisions relating to CSR planning, implementation, monitoring, evaluation & reporting, etc.

- Consequences of non-compliance is not mentioned.
- Lack of sermons (e.g., training, education, sharing of information on best practices on CSR) and carrots (rewards for good CSR practices).


